

## **St. Juliana Health Program**

The health program at our school is administered by Alex Bruttig and Dolores Stauber. Other employees of the clinic are volunteer parents and not licensed medical personnel. The health program at our school provides first aid and care to all students, athletes, teachers, visitors, and workers on campus on a daily basis.

**Health screenings** are provided to the students annually. Consent forms for these are provided with the registration paperwork.

Vision Screening	- grades K - 6
Colorblindness Screening	- grade K boys
Hearing Screening	- grade K, 2, 5, and 8
Scoliosis Screening	- grades 5 (girls), 6 - 8 (all)

Any significant findings are recorded and parents are notified either verbally or in writing by our personnel.

**Dental screening** is no longer performed at the advice of local dentists, given the excellent dental hygiene witnessed in our students over the past years.

**Lice check screenings** are also done on an as-needed basis, will follow-up checks administered when students return to school after treatment.

Daily tasks by the health room staff include the washing of blankets, providing first aid as needed, and maintaining an adequate supply of bandages, gloves, tissue paper, underwear, feminine hygiene products, diabetic nourishment supplies, thermometer probe covers, and ice packs. No medications are administered by the health room staff, unless authorization form is sent in by parent.

Annual diabetic instruction for the teachers is provided by and the responsibility of the school, not the health room staff. Teachers are CPR certified and renew every two years.
